

## ACHIEVING THE TTNO STATUS OF "RECOGNIZED TEACHER"

All Recognized Practitioners are eligible to become Recognized Teachers.

If there is any question about the Student Teacher's suitability the TTNO reserves the right to decline Recognized Teacher status

## RELATIONSHIP TO THE THERAPEUTIC TOUCH NETWORK OF ONTARIO

The student teacher:

- 1. Is a Recognized Practitioner in good standing with the TTNO
- 2. Has been a Recognized Practitioner for a minimum of two years prior to workshop submission.
- 3. Participates in Teachers Collective activities where possible.
- 4. Agrees to:
  - be Mentored by a TTNO Recognized Teacher
  - follow the Curriculum and Guidelines for Teaching Therapeutic Touch® and
  - submit workshop materials for each level taught following the format in the Guidelines.
  - read and sign the Statement of Ethics and Conduct for the Teaching of Therapeutic Touch.

## **CONTINUING STUDIES**

The student teacher has:

- 1. Repeated the submitted Level with at least 2 different teachers. This is to:
  - experience a variety of personal teaching styles and methods suited to the applicant
  - develop the required workshop materials in his/her own style
- 2. It is recommended that the student teacher complete the "TT Student Teacher Form for Reviewing/Auditing a Workshop" in the Guidelines at least once for each level taught and review it with her Mentor.
